



Discuss what it is like to move to another country or somewhere new. Encourage your child to talk to a family member or friend of the family who has migrated. What were the differences? How did they feel?

Literacy skills

- Using formal and informal language.
- Writing in a range of genres, using appropriate language and layout.
- Using a range of adventurous punctuation.

Watch the news reports on the BBC iplayer and research events surrounding World War 2. Discuss with them why it is still important to remember past events and conflicts.

Topic skills

- Measure length on a map and convert to distance.
- Use geographical vocab relevant to topics: *immigration, refugee.*
- Explain how propaganda or misinformation might affect what we understand happened in the past

When you are going on a journey, work with your child to plan the route or read the time table. Encourage them to come up with alternative routes and work out timings for the journey.

RE skills

- Explain what beliefs and values inspire and influence Christians to demonstrate unconditional love.
- show an understanding of how religious belief shapes the lives of Christians in a variety of ways through their chosen vocation

Read the parable of The Prodigal Son with your child. What do you think the story means? What lessons can we take from it? How do Catholics show forgiveness?
