3) Topic

Greek Gods Family Tree

A family tree shows how people are related to each other, across many generations. A 'branch' on a family tree (which are the straight lines from the boxes) represents the children of a particular god or goddess.

In this week's resource list, there are two worksheet options - a really tricky sheet (version 2) or a 'not so tricky' sheet (version 1). Feel free to choose the one which will challenge you.

In the resource list, there is also an 'information sheet', for you to read, that includes clues, to help you fill in the Family Tree, with the correct Gods and Goddesses names, in the correct boxes. Make sure that you read this sheet carefully, before attempting to fill in the family tree and ensure that you refer back to it, throughout the task.

(If you don't have a printer, then neatly draw out the family tree, before starting the task.)
