



Discuss with your child what a trusted source is (BBC News) and what might be a source of propaganda or fake news (social media, unofficial news websites) and how to verify facts.

### Literacy skills

- Using formal and informal language.
- Writing in a range of genres, using appropriate language and layout.
- Using a range of adventurous punctuation.

Watch the news reports on the BBC iplayer and research events surrounding World War 2. Discuss with them why it is still important to remember past events and conflicts.

### Topic skills

- Measure length on a map and convert to distance.
- Use geographical vocab relevant to topics: *immigration, refugee.*
- Explain how propaganda or misinformation might affect what we understand happened in the past
