



# St. Saviour's RC Primary School

## 2022 to 2023 PE Grant Accountability

### Rationale

In the 2022 - 2023 academic year St Saviour's RC Primary School received **£17,650** PE Grant.

We are using the funding to –

- Buy-in specialist coaching for all classes from Nursery to Year 6.
- Deliver CPD for our Teachers to ensure effective and high quality first teaching for all our pupils.
- Enhance Lunch Play for children in Yr 1 to 6 with organised team games 12.15 to 1.30 daily
- Review the provision for non “ball games” by reviewing markings on the playground to encourage children who do not take part in ball games.
- Organise a Sports Day in which our children and parents can take part in sporting events and celebrate healthy living as a community.
- Organise and deliver a wider range of sporting activities as part of our after school Enrichment Clubs.
- Improve the range and quality of our PE equipment.
